To Our Generous Supporters,

In pursuit of recovering the endemic Yellow Naped Parrot from extinction on the island of Guanaja, Honduras, the Green Island Challenge is pleased to announce that in just 3 years of field-work, environmental education, and community building, we have *tripled* the number of parrots from 323 in 2018, to 1,060 individuals in 2021.

The Green Island Challenge began installing supplemental nests to encourage reproduction, and conducting daily patrols to prevent parrot poaching with the goal of increasing the Yellow Naped population to a 1000 individuals in 5 years (2018- 2023). We complement our field work with educational programming, and community leadership development.

Since we have achieved our conservation goal early, we are readjusting, and now project to increase the parrot population size up to 1,500 individuals by 2023, **a fivefold increase over five years!**

As an additional success of 2021, the Green Island Challenge was able to expand and replicate our species recovery model on the neighboring island of Roatan where Yellow Naped Parrot populations are in even a more precarious state with less than 50 individuals.

These accomplishments would not have been possible without the support of One Earth Conservation, the Neotropical Bird Club, Seacology, and private donors. Thank you for caring about this species, and entrusting the Green Island Challenge with the mission of recovering the Yellow Naped Parrot population from extinction on Guanaja.
